From Service-Learning to e-Service-Learning: the role of technology-mediated experience for the soft skills development in higher education

Current higher education policies require universities to prepare students to integrate into everchanging societies - where technical skills rapidly become obsolete - by promoting the development of soft skills. Adopting a mixed methods research approach, the study analyses the effectiveness of e-Service-Learning (technology-mediated service-learning) for the development of personal, social, methodological and digital skills of university students in Italy and Chile.
